September 13th begins a new Religious Exploration year!

We will offer again two opportunities for Religious Exploration on Sunday morning: Young UU Worship, for ages infant through 18, in the Fellowship Hall at 9:15 followed by age-specific classes until 10:30; and Spirit Play, a multi-age experience, from 11 to noon.
