#### A Faith Journey by Rev. Carie Johnsen...

Wow, can this really be the beginning of our fourth year of ministry together? Truly it seems like just yesterday when I was your candidate and we were discerning whether we were the right minister and congregation match. These last three years of getting to know each other has been rich and deepening. Each years affirms my knowing I am in the right place, engage in the right ministry with the right people.

As I enter this new year I am so excited about continuing this ministry together. The summer has been a flurry of faith in action with Jenny McKendry leading the work to organize UUCC's commitment to the free public suppers on the third Saturday in June, July and August. It is not easy to serve more than 100 meals in an hour.

The Immigration Work Group has organized the second annual Migrant Farmworker Welcome where the gathered community of Haitian blueberry pickers and UUCC members of all ages enjoyed a picnic and some soccer at Mill Park. Welcome bags were delivered to a farmworker health clinic held at the annex. Jill and Allan Watson worked to recognize the just work practices of a local farm recommended by the Maine Migrant Health Program.

And UUCC remains a leader in LGBTQ justice in the Kennebec Valley. Many members and friends are already engaged with the work to secure a yes vote on same sex marriage in November. I join Maggie Ricker in leading a group of religious leaders in the greater Augusta community as we plan several interfaith events. Stay tuned for more information on an interfaith worship service at Capital Park on Sunday afternoon, October 14th.

As anyone who supported, led or attended a summer worship will tell you the lay leaders of this congregation know how to deliver quality services with a diversity of themes and leaders. The services, including the summer children's program, as well as the above summer faith in action programs, are just one more reminder this is a twelve month congregation.

As we begin to prepare for a new church year, the calendars are filling up quickly with board training, leadership retreat, DRE startup, worship arts retreat and by the end of all this, the holidays will be on our doorstep.

By the time you read this, Rev. Carol Strecker will be settled into her office as our full-time Director of Religious Exploration. After recognizing the need for expanding the religious educator position to full-time for well over a decade, the time has come to make the leap forward. Strong vibrant visionary religious educator leadership is such a vital element in nurturing and sustaining Unitarian Universalist families and communities in the twenty-first century.

Over the summer the Music Search Committee has been busy receiving applications and conducting interviews with the hopes of making a recommendation to the Board at the September meeting. As some of you know the plan is to hire a Music Director who will take up the work of directing the choir with a vision of building upon the music program as resources allow.

Yes, my summer vacation was relaxing and revitalizing; and I am ready to be back in the fold of beloved community. As we embark on this new church year, may we be gifted with opportunity to grow in deeper relationship with each other, with greater Augusta and global community and the interdependent web of which we are a part.

#### From the Board President ...

#### **Growing Together**

For the past five years, church leadership has emphasized the ideal of having trained lay leaders. Over that period, board members have attended many workshops, conferences and training sessions to help make this idea a reality in our congregation.

In late August, members of the board and our minister, Carie Johnsen, participated in an all-day training at the Allen Avenue UU Church in Portland. At the invitation of the new District Executive for Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont, Joe Sullivan, Allen Avenue hosted a meeting of seven southern Maine boards and their ministers.

One of the important aspects of the day was to compare notes on how our congregations are faring. For me, it was eye-opening. Many of our peer congregations have had to face enormous challenges since the onset of the recession in 2008. As most of you know, the Brunswick congregation lost their church to a fire last year, and are just now opening bids on a contract to rebuild on the same site.

But many other congregations have also struggled. Some have had to dip deeply into their endowments, and are now facing difficult decisions for the years ahead. Others have cut back on staff hours and even eliminated positions.

As I reflected on the day, I realized again how fortunate we have been at UUCC. Despite the challenges we have also faced, we have managed to restore our three buildings, which are now in the best shape they've been in years. In August, we welcomed our first full-time Religious Exploration director Carol Strecker, who will bring new energy and excellence to one of our most important programs. And we've been able to maintain and even increase the financial support from our members and friends.

This is not a time to rest, of course. We have many goals still before us. But it's also good to stop for a moment and reflect on what a growing and thriving church it is we are building together.

She helps us save hundreds of dollars! Thank you to Abby. The Augusta Food Bank has an auction coming up to raise money, which helps numerous people, ourselves included. It will be held on October 26th, at the Calumet club. It'll be the place to be! Last year Carie and I and a few other UU's were there. I got some venison which was donated by Abby's family, my son was thrilled!

Hannaford Gift Cards for Sale in Assorted Denominations—Church Gets 5% Bonus. As a member of Judy & Bruce's Fundraising Committee, Hannah Faulkner, or someone on her team-Betty Armstrong, Terry Cookson, Sunshine Perlis and Jill Watson-will sell you, at face value, a Hannaford Gift Card that you can use like cash in any Hannaford store to pay for any purchases. Gift Cards are available following the church service August 26, September 9 and other Sundays. Payment may be made via cash or a check made out to UUCC of Augusta.

In a group order coordinated by her on behalf of UUCC, these cards may be "reloaded" by Hannah Faulkner on most Mondays with additional amounts up to a balance of \$500. The church receives a 5% bonus from Hannaford for a card purchase coordinated through the church totaling \$1,000 or more at one time. UUCC is working on soon having ACH (automatic debit) capability available. So for routine shopping, presents, support of another person or other reason, please plan to use a Gift Card from Church.
